Je'Caryous Johnson's New Novel Unearths New Truths Regarding Finding the Right Man or Woman

HOUSTON (March 22, 2010) – Playwright and author Je'Caryous Johnson's latest book, *I'm a Good Man, You're a Good Woman ... Why Can't We Find Each Other* (I'm Ready Publishing, ISBN: 978-0-9787301-9-2; U.S. \$19.95; 96 pages; published March 2010) explores the obstacles people face in the search for lasting relationships. In his book, Johnson says: "My advice is to stop looking for your good man or good woman. Think about all the times you've looked in the past and how that ended. Matthew 6:33 says to seek first the kingdom of God and all these things shall be added unto you. My take on that is to walk in your purpose and you will find joy, even in your problems. Once you experience that joy—that peace that surpasses all understanding—it's only then that your good man or woman will be found."

Good Man, Good Woman chronicles the personal experiences of Johnson, his close friends and colleagues. Additionally, Johnson conducted a survey on his Web site, JeCaryousJohnson.com, and received thousands of responses. A cross section of those comments are captured in the book.

"I've found that people can tend to get in their own way," Johnson said. "With this book, I hope that readers can identify with my experiences and those of my friends and survey respondents. And then, change the things they keep doing which gives them negative results."

"I was moved to write this book because I came across so many stories with similar outcomes. Alarming, there was a pervasive feeling of hopelessness among men and women alike. I want people to know that their good mate is out there. Just don't give up. Approaching the situation from a fresh perspective makes the impossible seem possible."
